How will we do the research?

By talking to young people in groups

What will the focus group be like?

There will be around 12 young people the same age as you sitting around a table in a room in your school/college with Heather. She will ask you questions about different types of betting and gaming and what you think of them. The discussion will last about 50 mins. We will record the discussion.

Can I change my mind about taking part or answering?

Yes, of course. You can change your mind or leave the room anytime you want to. You can also skip any questions you don't want to answer.

Will my name be used?

No, we'll give you a different name and we'll change the name of your school, so that no one reading about the project knows who you really are.

Is it confidential?

- ✓ Yes. We won't tell anybody what you said.
- ✓ But if you tell you us something that makes us worried about your safety or the safety of someone else, we may have to let someone else know what you've said, but we will always talk to you first if it happens.

What will happen afterwards?

- ✓ We will listen to the recording from your discussions and those from other schools, and then we'll write about young people's views and experiences of betting and gaming (e.g., in a book or a report).
- ✓ All information will be fully anonymized, so people won't know who took part. This anonymized data may be shared with other researchers who are interested in this topic. With your permission, may use quotes of things people said in our report but we will not say who said them, the quotes will be anonymized.
