Dear parents/guardians

With Easter falling late this year, the spring term has felt a long one and I am sure everyone is ready for the two-week break. For many students in the upper school, this is a time to consolidate revision efforts ahead of the final push.

This month has been busy and the student speakers we have seen in school assemblies have been very impressive. A large number have taken to the stage to present on their areas of interest. This week, we have heard from the cadets of their experiences over recent weeks, along with representatives from the 'Change your mind' and 'Wellbeing Group'. Last week, the Youth Integration Champions introduced their 'Breaking bread, breaking barriers' event, which saw a number of visitors attend the school to promote social cohesion. Staff and students from QMGS ran taster sessions in maths, PE, art and DT this week and the year 5s had a great time. We hope it inspires them to want to come to us in the future.
