I need to make you aware of a serious road traffic incident that occurred outside the school two weeks ago, where a sixth form girl was hit by a car. She was, fortunately, not seriously hurt, but it clearly raises issues about the Sutton Road.

We started a SLT duty last year, where one of our team each day is on the Sutton Road from 8.30-8.45 and 15.40-16.00. I speak regularly in assembly to students and I am going to write to the police, local MP and council over convening a meeting. I have also written to other local schools and I must also make a plea to you, as parents, about responsible driving and parking on the road. If you can drop children off further away from the school gates, then please do so. Please work with us to make the local area a safer place.
