### QMGS updates 28-8-20

Dear parent/guardian

Further to my <u>letter</u> dated 21-8-20, please find below some updates and clarification. The risk assessment has been updated and can be found on the <u>Policies page</u> of the School website.

#### 1. Face coverings

The government has published new guidance on face coverings for schools and colleges.

Key points from the guidance are as follows:

- For schools and colleges in most circumstances (i.e. not subject to local restrictions/lockdowns) the government is still not recommending face coverings as necessary in education settings.
- However, schools and colleges have the discretion to require face coverings for pupils and staff in communal areas where social distancing cannot be safely managed, if they believe that it is right in their particular circumstances.
- The use of face coverings in the classroom should still be avoided because they "can have a negative impact on learning and teaching".
- For schools and colleges in areas where local restrictions apply, face coverings should be worn by adults and pupils when moving around, such as in corridors and communal areas where social distancing is difficult to maintain.
- Further guidance on face coverings for areas where local restrictions apply will be issued and will come into effect on 1 September.
- Staff and pupils will be expected to buy or make their own face coverings. Schools and colleges will be expected to have a "small contingency supply" available to supplement this.

As a result of this, our policy on face coverings from September is:

- Students may wear face coverings in communal areas (e.g. canteen, corridors), but this is optional for them
- Face coverings should be plain in design and students will be given a disposable version if this is not the case
- Face coverings should not be worn by students in classrooms (unless previously agreed through an individual risk assessment)
- Staff have the option of wearing a mask or face visor, which will be provided by the School

#### 2. MS Forms survey
