

<p><b>Leaders promote high expectations and use rigorous systems to drive improvement, including through monitoring and developing the quality of 16 to 19 provision and improving the progress and achievement of learners and groups of learners</b></p>	<p>Senior and middle leaders regularly evaluate and monitor the curriculum at both a whole school and department level. Meetings take place every term to monitor data and help the achievement of all learners. Lesson observations of KS5 lessons also take place regularly.</p>
<p><b>Study programmes for each learner are planned and managed so that they fully meet the principles of the DfE's 16 to 19 study programmes by providing progression, stretch, mathematics and English for all learners without GCSE grades A* to C, as well as work experience and non-qualification activities</b></p>	<p>As an academic sixth form, offering just A Level qualifications, all pupils must gain at least a 6 in English and Mathematics alongside 54 points from their best 8 subjects</p> <p>We offer Core Maths for those Y12s without a 7 in Maths. All students follow an additional option on top of their core three A-levels. This includes the EPQ, ILM leadership award, beginners' Mandarin, leadership in sport and languages, a qualification in finance, amongst other options.</p> <p>Pupils are supported to complete 5 days of workplace experience during their time in the sixth-form in line with the Gatsby benchmarks. Work Experience placements will take place during the school holidays in 2020-21, along with virtual placements</p> <p>All sixth formers are expected to volunteer or mentor during their time in the school. This may be with younger students, or as part of one of the School's outreach programmes (such as Change Your Mind).</p>
<p><b>Teaching and assessment support and challenge learners</b></p>	<p>We expect our students to work hard, to think for themselves and to pursue academic excellence with determination and discipline. The high level of A Level results show that we both stretch and support our learners at QMGS.</p>
<p><b>Learners receive high quality impartial careers guidance to prepare them for their chosen next steps and to enable them to make well-informed decisions about their future plans</b></p>	<p>A range of advice is given; from discussions with form tutors, Higher Education Fairs, and discussions with former pupils who often visit the school. Unifrog is used throughout school to build up a picture of pupil experiences and identify needs.</p> <p>All year 12 pupils receive a Careers Interview in the summer term (after Y12 exams) to support Post-18 pathway decisions and career aspirations. A trained careers advisor is available for appointments at the Y12/Y13 parents evening. Careers education is delivered directly via carousel lessons in Year 12.</p>

<p><b>Study programmes build on each learner's prior attainment and enable them to make progress and move on to a higher level of qualification when they are ready to do so</b></p>	<p>The programmes of study are excellent preparation for progression into Higher Education in the vast majority of cases, or apprenticeships and employment at 18. Additional academic options (such as the EPQ) are also used to broaden pupil study and give them choice.</p>
<p><b>Learners develop personal, social, employability and independent learning skills, and achieve high levels of punctuality, attendance and conduct, including through the contribution of non-qualification or enrichment activities and/or work experience</b></p>	<p>Opportunities for work experience and volunteering are listed above.</p> <p>The spirit of our Latin motto (approximately: "you get out what you put in") gives life to a wide range of activities. We have music and drama, sports teams taking part in Rugby, Hockey, Cricket and Cross Country fixtures, and a nationally successful Combined Cadet Force with a wide programme of Army and RAF activities. We are particularly proud to own a Field Centre, Farchynys, on the Barmouth Estuary.</p>

There are a variety of events during the year, such as Mental Health Awareness in February.</p>
