A message from the Headmaster, November 2020

First word

It is no secret that the past month has been a challenge for the school. With the onset of winter, we have seen more positive Covid-19 cases and resulting self-isolations. This has affected staff, as well as students and I am grateful to everyone for their flexibility and understanding. The decisions to provide remote education for Years 11 and 12 were not taken lightly and were as a result of the extraordinary pressures we are under. Year 11 have returned this week to sit their mock exams and it has been good to have them back. Year 12 are working at home until the middle of next week and we hope this disruption will be an exception, rather than the rule.

We have tried to maintain some QM normality and it was a delight to hold the Speech Day assemblies before half-term. We are working on plans for a prize giving event; watch this space! We also ran a virtual Remembrance assembly on 11th November and, despite not being able to be together as a community in person, this was as poignant as ever.

The PE, music and Mandarin departments have continued to run activities outside of the school day, within the DfE guidelines and I am pleased that so many students are still accessing our co-curricular offerings. The CCF parades have moved to a digital format and I hope that the cadets are accessing this. We hope to see a return to year group parades in person in the New Year.

Finally, we have featured a number of events and initiatives in school assemblies to promote Black History Month. Students from the History department have presented to the School on different aspects of Black History and Mrs Gray reported back on the winners of the Art department's competition. I have included the winners at the end of this email. The English department are also engaging with sixth form students on a review of the curriculum, with regards to the representation of BAME writers and viewpoints. I am proud that we have a school where these things are possible.




CALLING ALL ASPIRING ARTISTS AT QMGS


