Keith Howard, Headmaster of QMGS 1979-95

It is with sadness that we learnt this month of the death of Mr Keith Howard, Headmaster of the School from 1979-95. In a tribute shared with the alumni, Mr Swain wrote the following extract:

"The School's 34th Headmaster brought the vigour and rigour of a new broom to a School that was feeling battered by its fight for survival as a grammar school. To his orders, hair was cut short, shoes polished, shirts tucked in: nothing escaping his notice. Gradually, attention to detail, to what he termed the bread and butter of school life, began to pay dividends in the big picture. By raising the bar in matters of uniform and courtesy, Mr Howard managed to raise expectations of what could be achieved in terms of academic success. It seems to me that not the least of Mr Howard's achievements was for the School to rank top in the UK in the first school League Tables."

It is interesting that these values live on and I have found it humbling to read the tributes which have come in for Mr Howard. We send our condolences to his family and we hope to arrange for a permanent memorial in the New Year.

Staff leaving

Three members of staff are leaving us at the end of term. Mr Drewett joined us in September and has made a big impact over the term. We are grateful for his input into the pastoral team and through his contributions to the PE and PSHEE departments. Mrs Wood leaves us after 3 years working behind the scenes in HR and payroll. She has worked hard to ensure systems and processes are in place and that staff are supported. I am grateful for all of her input and wish her well for her relocation nearer to family in Yorkshire. Finally, Mrs Chatwin is stepping down from her SEMH role, which she has held since 2017. She has been on the staff since 2011 and I know what a difference she has made to the lives of students and staff here. I'm sure we will see her back in the school, but I would like to thank her for everything she has done.

Covid-19 management and controls

As a result of the change in the self-isolation period for close contacts from 14-10 days, I have updated the <u>guidance document</u> on our website.

Please do continue to report through positive cases to the enquiries email address and mark them as URGENT. We will be processing track and issues on Monday 21st and Wednesday 23rd December, so please do monitor email accounts.

Please remember the other key control measures in operation:

- a requirement that people who are ill stay at home
- robust hand and respiratory hygiene procedures by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach
- enhanced cleaning arrangements
- active engagement with NHS Test and Trace
- a zonal approach and a reduction in close contacts
- Compulsory face coverings on entry/exit to school, in corridors and public areas (except when eating in the canteen)

The government have also released guidance on protective measures in the home.

We have made a change to the date of the Year 10 parents' evening. This will now be held virtually on Thursday 25th February 2021. Information on the booking system and online platform will be issued in January.
