How to get help



The census is here

It informs decisions about the things that matter to your community.

This leaflet outlines the wide range of accessibility support available to help you take part in **Census 2021**.

It's important to fill in your census questionnaire because it gives us the most detailed information we have about our society. You must complete the census by law.

Census data helps inform funding decisions on public services in your area. Whether it's planning new schools, doctors' surgeries or bike lanes, the information you share has an impact on the lives of everyone living in England and Wales.

When should I fill in my census questionnaire?

Census Day is **Sunday 21 March** – but you can fill yours in as soon as you get your access code in the post.

Your answers should be about the people who usually live in your household on this date – even if you're filling it before then.

If your household circumstances change on Census Day, you can let us know.

Deaf, speech or hearing impairments

The online census questionnaire is compatible with most assistive technologies. On the census website, you will find **videos using BSL and subtitles** that contain all the information you need to take part. If you have any questions, you can ring our **text relay service** (see 'Get in touch' section for details).



Lack confidence online

We aim to make things as easy as possible for everyone, but if you need support to complete your census online, we're here to help. Our staff are available on the phone or online to provide practical support and guidance.

If you cannot get online, Census Support Centres are available across England and Wales*. If you prefer, **you can request a paper questionnaire.**

Learning disabilities or cognitive impairments

To help you take part in the census, we've created an **easy read** information leaflet. **Call us to request one.**



Physical impairments

Our **staff are available** with a wide range of support services to help you fill in your census. **Get in touch for advice.**



Blind or partially sighted

Most assistive technologies are compatible with the online census questionnaire, and we have created **videos with audio** to share important guidance.

You can order a **braille guidance booklet**, which includes information and translations of the census questions. You can also order a **large-print** paper questionnaire pack. For help or to order, **get in touch.**



Language support

Guidance booklets are available in 49 languages in England from www.census.gov.uk/languages and 19 languages in Wales from www.cyfrifiad.gov.uk/ieithoedd. They provide information and translate all the questions in the census questionnaire.

If you'd like to ask a question using an **interpreter**, you can call the free language helpline (see 'Get in touch' section for details). If someone is not immediately available, you can book an appointment for later.



Limited online access

If you are not able to get online, do not worry.

Our Census Support Centres provide support and **access to devices, such as computers and tablets**, to help you fill in your census form*. These are conveniently located across England and Wales. Call us free to find your nearest centre.
