A message from the Headmaster, April 2021

First word

It is with sadness that I start my monthly update with news of the passing of a former colleague. Mrs Jane Phillips worked at the school as a Food Technology teacher from 2010-2020. When I joined the school in 2011 as deputy head, I was immediately struck by the energy and enthusiasm of Mrs Phillips. The Food Technology room was a hub of activity and life, with staff and students alike drawn to it because of her infectious character. I very much enjoyed dropping into the room on a regular basis to catch up with Mrs Phillips and to speak to the students who taking part in the classes and enrichment that she ran. The room was always full of laughter and enjoyment and I am sure that there are a great many present and former students who have been set off on the right path for a healthy lifestyle because of her work. She put me through my paces on a number of occasions with her professionally delivered food safety courses and was a patient and accessible teacher. Her contribution to the wider life of the school, through the QMA and support for a huge number of events, was hugely valued and the school is a better place for Mrs Phillips being a part of it. All at QMGS will miss her, but she will never be forgotten.

Application of the substance abuse policy

Following an incident before the Easter holiday, three students have left the school as a result of a contravention of the <u>Substance Abuse Policy</u>. I spoke to the students about this in assembly last week and emphasised that the School strongly opposes substance abuse (such as drugs, Legal Highs, alcohol, solvents and tobacco) and that we will take appropriate disciplinary action against offenders. Any pupil found to be in possession of an illegal substance, or Legal High substance can expect to be permanently excluded. Please take the time to support these messages in family discussions at home and report any concerns to the school.

Year 11 and 13 assessments and early closure for moderation

Assessments are underway and both students and staff are working hard to ensure positive outcomes. We will be communicating more details to Year 11 and 13 parents/students this week with regards to the School's policy around the awarding of grades this summer. Internet Watch Foundation campaign

In the last year, <u>"self-generated" child sexual abuse imagery</u> has increased by 77% and is a third of all child sexual abuse material identified and removed from the internet. These included images of girls aged 11 to 13 whose abuse had been recorded via a webcam in a domestic setting.

To help prevent the creation of this type of abusive imagery, a campaign has been launched by the Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) backed by the Home Office and Microsoft. It aims to help raise awareness of this type of criminality among parents and carers of young teens, empower and educate girls aged 11 to 13+ to spot the techniques used by sexual predators and give them the knowledge to Block, Report, Tell someone they trust. It is a national campaign running from Wednesday 21 April for six weeks. You can find out more on the IWF website, as well as specific sites for parents and young people.

Travel, road safety and traffic around the school

I have written extensively in the past about traffic around the school site and parents may have noticed a recent increase in the number of police and community officer personnel at peak times. This is part of our drive towards improving the safety and traffic compliance around the school site. I have received a number of complaints from residents since we returned in March about inconsiderate parking and trespassing on private land from people connected to the school. I urge you to be considerate when parking and driving around the local area and to read signs carefully on access.

The DfE are promoting the following messages on how students can travel to and from school safely:

- if you live a short distance from your school or college, walk, cycle or scoot to and from school wherever it is possible and safe to do so
- avoid sharing a car with anyone outside of your household or support bubble
- if you are using public transport to get to school or college, plan ahead and allow more time for your journey
- when you are travelling by public or dedicated school transport, don't forget to:
 - wear a face covering (unless you are exempt including if you are aged 11 and under). It is important you wear them for the entirety of your journey, including inside a bus or train station
 - social distance where possible
 - wash or sanitise your hands regularly
 - be considerate to fellow passengers and staff.

Further information can be found in our <u>guidance on transport to school and other places of education</u>. The Department for Transport has also created <u>resources</u> that can be downloaded and used by education settings to promote safe travel to school.

Testing and contact tracing in schools and colleges

Following the asymptomatic testing programme on the return to school and college, it is vital to keep testing at home throughout the summer term. All students should have received additional home-testing kits. Staff and students should:

- continue to test twice a week at home (all those who are able to)
- report positive, negative or void results using the <u>report a COVID-19 rapid lateral flow test result</u> portal
- test before returning to school or college for the summer term, either the night before, or morning of, the first day back to find and isolate any positive cases
- Continue to use our <u>established reporting procedures</u>
