Parent App

To enable you to monitor and impact your child's attendance, behaviour and achievements in school, the school uses an information sharing app called 'Parent App'. You can access the app from a smartphone, tablet or PC – anytime, anywhere. The app will give you daily updates on your child's attendance, positive achievements and any potential behaviour points. School reports, student timetables, messages and key dates can also be shared through the app.

The app will also provide you with the ability to update your contact details so we always have the most up-to-date information in case of an emergency. The majority of school communication is sent by email and Parent App so it is crucial that you keep your contact details updated. Testing and contact tracing in school

Students are expected to keep carrying out LFTs at home throughout the half term holiday and remainder of the summer term. All students should have received additional home-testing kits. Staff and students should:

- continue to test twice a week at home (all those who are able to)
- report positive, negative or void results using the [report a COVID-19 rapid lateral flow test result portal](#)

- test before returning to school or college for the summer term, either the night before, or morning of, the first day back to find and isolate any positive cases

Travel, road safety and traffic around the school

I have written extensively in the past about traffic around the school site and parents may have noticed a recent increase in the number of police and community officer personnel at peak times. This is part of our drive towards improving the safety and traffic compliance around the school site. I have received a number of complaints from residents since we returned in March about inconsiderate parking and trespassing on private land from people connected to the school. Recently, I have received specific communication on:

- Encroachment on private property on Princes Avenue/Sutton Road Junction
- Use of the private access road from the Broadway North onto the Sutton Road as a short cut

I urge you to be considerate when parking and driving around the local area and to read signs carefully on access.
