A message from the Headmaster, October 2021

First word

As we approach the end of the half term, I think it is important to look back positively on how the students and staff have embraced the QM experience in all of their involvement in School life. The Twitter account gives the usual view on the richness of our wider curriculum and I have had no shortage of content for School assemblies. In particular, it has been fantastic to see all the coverage in October of activities around Black History Month. The students have spoken very personally about their experiences in assemblies, the QM Perspectives and the See Yourself group. We have all taken inspiration from the reading recommendations from the English department and were very privileged this week to host the author Alex Wheatle. We sincerely hope that the new Covid restrictions are only short lived and we can continue delivering our rich co-curricular offering. As I said in my letter last week, Speech Day has been postponed until later in the year and Thursday 21st October is a regular school day, finishing at 3.40pm. Half term will start at this point.

Covid updates and the vaccine roll out

I wrote to all parents last week with details of changes we have had to put in place from 18th October. The letter can be accessed here. This will be reviewed by Walsall Public Health after half term and I will write to you with any changes. Please do continue to keep us informed on cases and follow the School's guidance.

A joint letter has been written to parents of secondary school and college students in England on Covid-19 testing and vaccines from the Secretaries of State for Education and for Health and Social Care. We are waiting on exact details of the 12-15 vaccination roll out at QMGS, but the consent letter from the NHS can be accessed <u>here.</u>

16 and 17 year olds can now use the online booking service for their COVID-19 vaccine. The Department of Health and Social Care announced on Friday 24 September that all 16 and 17 year olds can now book their first COVID-19 vaccination appointment online.

Young people aged 16 and 17 can:

- book their COVID-19 vaccination appointments online for an appointment at a vaccination centre or pharmacy
- find a walk-in COVID-19 vaccination site to get vaccinated without needing an appointment

Absences for appointments

May I remind parents/carers, as per the Home School Agreement, the below process for absences relating to appointments during the school day:

- Where possible try and schedule appointments after school and during school holidays
- If this is not possible, then provide as much notice as possible, or at least three working days' notice. This should be sent to absences@qmgs.walsall.sch.uk with a copy of the appointment notification
- If you attending the appointment during the school day, you are required to collect your child from Reception and sign them out using the Exeat Book, you will need to sign them back in on their return
- If the appointment is before school you are required to accompany your child back into school and sign the Exeat Book
- Parents are not allowed to drive onto the school site, please park off site legally and with consideration for local residents
- Parents need to ensure that their child is aware of what time he/she is being collected. The student will be responsible for making their way to Reception so that they are ready for collection when you arrive to sign them out.

Uniform shop

For students who have lost their School ties and want to purchase a replacement, they are now able to purchase the ties via the School online Sports Store, which can then be picked up from Reception with proof of purchase.

FSM FAQs (Mrs Youngman)

Second hand uniform

An appeal was previously made for uniform and sportswear, in good condition, which your child has grown out of. We had an excellent response and are in the process of sorting through these items. These items will be made available, on a discretionary basis, to families with a need. Wearing of gum shields for rugby and hockey

Please can families be reminded that although the sporting bodies for both hockey and rugby advise that pupils should wear gum shields the school is looking to make this compulsory for all participants in games afternoons who are playing these sports. Gum shields are inexpensive and can either be obtained from a local sports shop for around £10, the school sports store or fitted by a dentist (around £50). Traffic and parking around the School

I have written extensively in the past to parents in bid to encourage sensible driving and parking around the School. With the full return of the school in September, it has inevitably been busy, but it is disappointing to see many drivers not listening to my requests to take account of others. In particular, we have observed:

- Dangerous driving in the form of speeding and U turns down the length of the Sutton Road
- Inconsiderate parking particularly around driveways and on private property. We have received lots of feedback from residents, for example in the access road at the bottom of the Sutton Road and at the flats on the corner of Sutton Road and Princes Avenue

We have engaged with Walsall Police and the Council's Civil Parking Enforcement Officers, who can issue Penalty Charge Notices for parking offences relating to Traffic Regulation Orders, you may have seen an increased presence of the Enforcement Officers around the school; this will continue. I have spoken to the students about encouraging you to make different choices, such as:

- Dropping the students further away from school
- Using public transport
- Walking or cycling; a helmet must be worn when cycling

Please work with us on this to make the environment around the school a safer place.

Year 11 mock exams

Year 11 Mock Exams are due to start w/c 15 November. Timetables have been issued to students and these exams will be conducted under strict exam conditions in the Sports Hall to provide students with the opportunity to show what they can do in conditions as close to the real thing as possible. GCSE exams will be going ahead next summer, with some adaptions that have been announced by the government and so this is a really important opportunity for students to stretch themselves and for teachers to identify gaps in understanding.
