IN DEPTH

TO KILL A MOCKINGBIRD by Harper Lee

To Kill a Mockingbird, by Harper Lee is a fictional story on the front, but its themes are so much more than that. It is one of those books which you will have to read at some point and reading it as early as possible is ideal since it is a good entry point into books that explore deeper themes.

The story is told through Jean Louise "Scout" Finch, and it is about the unconventional hero and single parent Atticus Finch, the lawyer who stands up for a black man, charged with the rape of a white girl.

Atticus is known as a "moral" hero – and morality is the main theme of the book, as well as what is "right" and "wrong" and targeting the problems with the law. Atticus is not perfect, but at the same he has the ideal personality – he is not racist, sexist or homophobic, but he sees everyone as equal, and he fights indirectly to destroy bias.

To Kill a Mockingbird is a tough read – that is understandable – but you must at least give it a try. The themes of the book link into many real-life situations.


REAPER MAN by Terry Pratchett


I AM THE MINOTAUR by Anthony McGowan



77 bus

The school has been made aware by a number of families that the 77 bus route from Sutton Coldfield to Walsall has part of its route terminated from December 5th. The school has written to National Express expressing our concerns about the closure and the effect on our pupils and the short notice given.

Absence due to family illness and bereavement

Unfortunately students sometimes need leave due to close family illness or following bereavement, I understand that these are difficult and emotional times. This will not only ensure your child's absence is recorded as authorised but will allow me to make the relevant staff aware of the loss so that emotional support can be considered if needed

Covid updates and the vaccine roll out

We hosted the NHS vaccination team last week, as part of the roll out of 12-15 vaccines. I shared a joint <u>letter</u> in my last update (written to parents of secondary school and college students in England on Covid-19 testing and vaccines from the Secretaries of State for Education and for Health and Social Care).

16 and 17 year olds can use the online booking service for their COVID-19 vaccine The Department of Health and Social Care announced on Friday 24 September that all 16 and 17 year olds can now book their first COVID-19 vaccination appointment <u>online</u>.

Young people aged 16 and 17 can:

- <u>book their COVID-19 vaccination appointments online</u> for an appointment at a vaccination centre or pharmacy
- find a walk-in COVID-19 vaccination site to get vaccinated without needing an appointment



Traffic and parking around the School

I have written extensively in the past to parents in bid to encourage sensible driving and parking around the School. Unfortunately, we have continued to witness examples of dangerous driving and inconsiderate parking.

We have engaged with Walsall Police and the Council's Civil Parking Enforcement Officers, who can issue Penalty Charge Notices for parking offences relating to Traffic Regulation Orders, you may have seen an increased presence of the Enforcement Officers around the school; this will continue. We are also involved with the Council's A-stars scheme.

I have spoken to the students about encouraging you to make different choices, such as:

- Dropping the students further away from school
- Using public transport
- Walking or cycling; a helmet must be worn when cycling and students should make sure they are fully visible (through lights and clothing) in the winter months

Please work with us on this to make the environment around the school a safer place.


