As the autumn term draws to a close, I'm sure that all members of the school community are looking forward to a well-earned break over Christmas. We have tried to run as many activities this term as possible, as can be seen via the School's <u>Twitter account</u>, but it hasn't been possible to hold some of the larger events. The cadets returned to Farchynys last weekend for their Arctic warfare trip and it was great to see the return of drama on the 12th December, with Mr Williams and the students involved in the MOMO programme performing to a small audience. We look forward to more performances later in the year. Mr Kolaric has overseen the production of the QM Observer and this will be available later this week via the <u>website</u>.

One of the events we haven't been able to run is the Christmas concert, but I am delighted to share the <u>link</u> here of the online version. I am grateful to Mr Vause and all of the musicians for the work that has gone into this and I look forward to the return of in-person concerts in the spring.

End of autumn term 2021

We are holding a **Christmas jumper day on Wednesday 15th December**, to raise money for *Save the Children*. Students can wear a Christmas jumper, along with their usual school uniform, in exchange for the donation of £1 via Parent Mail or in person. We are also serving our Christmas lunch on the same day, so please make sure that there is money on the student accounts.

Term will finish at **2pm on Thursday 16th December**, following a short registration. The Green Bus is running slightly earlier on that day. You should have received **end-of-term grades via the SIMS parent app**. Please contact the school if you haven't been able to access these or there are any issues.

Spring term 2022 and lateral flow tests

We are required by the DfE to carry out one lateral flow test per student upon their return in January. As a result, we are having to stagger the beginning of next term, with some groups working at home via Teams for part of the first week back. Our current Covid controls (set out in our <u>risk assessment</u>) will continue in January.

All students should make sure that they take home with them additional lateral flow tests and continue the twice weekly testing over the Christmas holiday. I have attached a letter regarding the on-site testing for January and please refer to our guidance (on the <u>parental letters page</u> of the website) if a student in unwell. Please do contact us with any questions.

Daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 (DfE update)

From Tuesday 14 December, a new national approach to daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 is being introduced (including until the end of this term). All adults who are fully vaccinated and children aged 5 to 18 years and 6 months, identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 – whether Omicron or not – should take a lateral flow device (LFD) test every day for 7 days instead of self-isolating. Daily testing by close contacts will help to slow the spread of COVID-19.

Once notified by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact, all eligible staff, pupils and students should take an LFD each day for 7 days and report the results through the <u>Online Reporting System</u> and to their setting. If they test negative, they can continue to attend their education setting. Outside of the education setting, they should continue to follow the advice set out in the <u>Sunday 12 December press release</u>. This approach should also be adopted over the winter break and on return in January.

If they test positive, they should self-isolate and <u>order a PCR test</u> to confirm the result. If the PCR is positive, they must self-isolate for 10 days. If the PCR test is negative, they no longer need to self-isolate but should continue to carry out the remainder of the daily tests, and only need to isolate if it is positive. All staff and secondary aged pupils and students should have access to a box of 7 LFD tests from their education setting. If your setting requires additional test kits sooner than they would be available through the standard ordering process, or will run out of test kits imminently, you can contact 119 to request an emergency replenishment. For primary aged children LFD test kits are available through the usual routes (community test sites, local pharmacies or online).

Finally, it is important to continue regular twice weekly, at-home testing for all education and childcare workforce and all students of secondary age and above.


Thank you to all those parents who have signed up to help the different QMA committees at the beginning of this year. We are looking forward to hosting our full range of events this year:

Traffic and parking around the School

I have written extensively in the past to parents in bid to encourage sensible driving and parking around the School. Unfortunately, we have continued to witness examples of dangerous driving and inconsiderate parking. Members of staff have also been spoken to in a rude and aggressive manner, whilst simply carrying out their duties and looking to safeguard the students. In one instance, this was reported to the police.

We have engaged with Walsall Police and the Council's Civil Parking Enforcement Officers, who can issue Penalty Charge Notices for parking offences relating to Traffic Regulation Orders, you may have seen an increased presence of the Enforcement Officers around the school; this will continue. We are also involved with the Council's A-stars scheme.

I have spoken to the students about encouraging you to make different choices, such as:

- Dropping the students further away from school
- Using public transport
- Walking or cycling; a helmet must be worn when cycling and students should make sure they are fully visible (through lights and clothing) in the winter months

Please work with us on this to make the environment around the school a safer place.
