## Lockers

The school is converting its stock of lockers to be padlock operated rather than key operated. Several lockers were converted during the Easter Break and the remainder will be done in time for the new Academic Year. To secure the lockers, students will need to supply a padlock. We most strongly recommend combination padlocks to avoid the chance of keys being lost.

In order to operate, the shank part of the lock needs to be between 4mm and 7mm diameter, most padlocks will therefore work however miniature luggage locks are unlikely to be sufficient.

Lockers will still shut and can be used without a padlock, but obviously do not then provide secure storage. Students whose lockers have been converted will be asked to return their existing keys. For those who have paid a key deposit this will then be returned, although it may take a little time for this to be processed.

## QMGs Breakfast Club

We have received a large number of students for the FREE Breakfast provision in school since Easter. The breakfast, which is provided by the National School Breakfast Programme, runs from 8am until 8.30am in the canteen and includes a bagel and a spread.

This will run until the end of the academic year with the hope that it will continue into next year. The National School Breakfast Programme is currently funded by the Department for Education and run by Family Action to support schools in England to provide children with a healthy breakfast at the start of the school day. Family Action is committed to supporting child development, and believe a healthy school breakfast, without barrier or stigma, can set up children to succeed and give them the very best chance to learn. In a normal school year, schools are open just over half the year (taking into account weekends and school holidays). This means even where breakfast is available within school, children are still having breakfast at home almost 50% of the time.

## Absences for appointments and religious observance

May I remind parents/carers, as per the [Attendance Policy](#), the below process for absences relating to appointments during the school day:

- Medical appointments should be arranged outside of school time wherever possible
- The school must be notified a minimum of 3 days in advance of any medical appointment that have been made. Without this prior notification and proof of the appointment, the absence will be marked as unauthorised
- This notification should be sent to [absences@qmgs.walsall.sch.uk](mailto:absences@qmgs.walsall.sch.uk) with a copy of the appointment notification
- If you are attending the appointment from school you are required to collect your child from Reception and sign them out using the Exit Book, you will need to sign them back in on their return
- If the appointment is before school you are required to accompany your child back into school and sign the Exit Book
- Parents are not allowed to drive onto the school site, please park off site legally and with consideration for local residents
- Parents need to ensure that their child is aware of what time he/she is being collected. The student will be responsible for making their way to Reception so that they are ready for collection when you arrive to sign them out.
- If you require some absence for the purpose of religious observance, please complete and return the form which is available on the school website via this [link](#)

### **Traffic and parking around the School**

Please continue to work with us in making the school environment a safer place. In particular, please consider the following:

- Not undertaking dangerous manoeuvres (such as U-turns or overtaking) on Sutton Road or surrounding streets
- Not parking inconsiderably near to resident driveways
- Not using access roads or resident only parking areas
- Dropping the students further away from school
- Encouraging the student to use public transport
- Walking or cycling; a helmet must be worn when cycling and students should make sure they are fully visible (through lights and clothing) in the winter months
