24 hour Maths Challenge (Mr Scott and Mr Mitchell)

One of the pillars of the school is 'generous in approach'. It is what you give that you will keep as eternal riches. It is in this spirit that Mr Scott and Mr Mitchell are organising an event 14th July to raise money and give to the cause of Birmingham Children's Hospital. 20 sixth form students are going to take part in a marathon of maths lessons, 24 hours of maths taught by 24 teachers of QMGS.

Maths will be taught from all different perspectives, science, English, History and yet again Mr Langton has agreed to take the hardest of lessons, at 5am. The students are hoping to raise more in this event than in previous years and would like to double the current total, raising more than £3000 for a worthy cause. Many of you will know someone that has been treated at BCH and know first-hand what an amazing charity this is to raise money for. E-Safety and the National online centre (Mrs Round)

We understand keeping up to date with your son or daughter's use of technology can be a challenge. How long should they be spending on their devices? What is safe for them to be doing online? Who are they speaking to? Many parents report feeling that their children know more about how to use electronic devices and the Internet than they do. Please remember you have the parental wisdom! Talking to you child about their online life is important. Don't blame, it is paramount everyone is as open and honest as possible. Finding out what apps they use, playing the games they like with them and discussing their use of social media are all key. Clearly, what is and is not appropriate will vary widely depending on your child's age. As a School we have recently subscribed to the National Online Safety service. This provides us with a range of up-to-date resources and training for students, staff and parents/carers. For parents and carers there are many short training courses, videos and one-page guides that you can access to learn more about e-safety. For example:

- What parents need to know about Discord, TikTok or Snapchat
- Online Safety Course for Parents of 14-18 year olds hosted by Myleene Klass
- Recorded webinars about topical issues such as: Screen Addiction, Online reputation, Age-inappropriate content, The Deep and Dark Web.

Their resources are regularly updated as technology and trends advance. We will be sharing some of the onepage guides through this newsletter throughout the year. QMGS Breakfast Club

We have received a large number of students for the FREE Breakfast provision in school since Easter. The breakfast, which is provided by the National School Breakfast Programme, runs from 8am until 8.30am in the canteen and includes a bagel and a spread.

This will run until the end of the academic year with the hope that it will continue into next year. The National School Breakfast Programme is currently funded by the Department for Education and run by Family Action to support schools in England to provide children with a healthy breakfast at the start of the school day. Family Action is committed to supporting child development, and believe a healthy school breakfast, without barrier or stigma, can set up children to succeed and give them the very best chance to learn. In a normal school year, schools are open just over half the year (taking into account weekends and school holidays). This means even where breakfast is available within school, children are still having breakfast at home almost 50% of the time.

Curriculum updates and information

We have updated all curriculum pathways for each key stage and these can be accessed via the school <u>website</u>. Please take the time to discuss these documents with your child.

Absences for appointments and religious observance

May I remind parents/carers, as per the <u>Attendance Policy</u>, the below process for absences relating to appointments during the school day:

- Medical appointments should be arranged outside of school time wherever possible
- The school must be notified a minimum of 3 days in advance of any medical appointment that have been made. Without this prior notification and proof of the appointment, the absence will be marked as unauthorised
- This notification should be sent to absences@qmgs.walsall.sch.uk with a copy of the appointment notification
- If you are attending the appointment from school you are required to collect your child from Reception and sign them out using the Exeat Book, you will need to sign them back in on their return
- If the appointment is before school you are required to accompany your child back into school and sign the Exeat Book
- Parents are not allowed to drive onto the school site, please park off site legally and with consideration for local residents
- Parents need to ensure that their child is aware of what time he/she is being collected. The student will be responsible for making their way to Reception so that they are ready for collection when you arrive to sign them out.
- If you require some absence for the purpose of religious observance, please complete and return the form which is available on the school website via this <u>link</u>

Traffic and parking around the School

Please continue to work with us in making the school environment a safer place. In particular, please consider the following:

- Not undertaking dangerous manoeuvres (such as U-turns or overtaking) on Sutton Road or surrounding streets
- Not parking inconsiderably near to resident driveways
- Not using access roads or resident only parking areas
- Dropping the students further away from school
- Encouraging the student to use public transport
- Walking or cycling; a helmet must be worn when cycling and students should make sure they are fully visible (through lights and clothing) in the winter months
