A message from the Headmaster, April/May 2023

#### First word

I have combined the news for April and May, given the Easter break, half term and bank holidays. I have also been waiting for the publication of the inspection report, which is now live on the <u>Ofsted website</u>. We are all delighted with the outcome and feel that it is a true reflection of the current school. Reflecting upon our journey over the past 5 years, with the formation of the Mercian trust, growth of the school and dealing with the pandemic, it is heartening to see that the QM values we hold dear to our hearts shine through. The report is fulsome of its praise across the curriculum and pastoral structures of the school and recognised the huge amount of work that goes into the wider personal development of the students.

Following the inspection, Mr Lee Roberts has stepped down as chair of governors and has written the following message for members of the community:

"Ofsted's award of an Outstanding Rating for Queen Mary's Grammar School is extremely good news, particularly in the context of Ofsted's stated aim to reduce significantly the proportion of schools in this category. Any school now rated Outstanding can truly regard itself as one of the best schools in the country. There can be no greater endorsement of the fantastic work undertaken by the Headmaster, the Senior Leadership Team, and all the school staff, supported so effectively by the Mercian Trust and my fellow governors over the last few years. Most of all, I would like to pay tribute to the students who make the school so special. Their ambition, energy, and enthusiasm to make the most of this wonderful school are the very qualities that make Queen Mary's truly an outstanding school. I am now stepping down and passing over the role to Neil Moseley, who brings a decade of experience both as a Member of the Governing Board and Link Governor for SEN. I wanted to take this opportunity to express my deep gratitude to all members of the school for working so hard and with such commitment and professionalism over the years. It has been a pleasure and an honour to serve such a dedicated and talented team."

I am grateful to Mr Roberts for the support he has given me and the School over the past 3 years in an extremely challenging period in education and wish him well for the future.

As we head into the May half term holiday, the exam season is well into swing. There are, however, a huge amount of extra-curricular activities taking place, which can be seen on the School's <u>Twitter</u> account. Mr Vause and the music department put on a memorable concert just before the Easter holiday and there have been a large range of trips taking place, to Farchynys and international shores. We also welcome volunteers to help on stalls throughout the event but also, donations of gifts that can be used for a tombola stall and a raffle.







# Summer Holiday Activities Programme (HAF) from Walsall Council

Walsall Council are currently in the planning stage of our HAF summer delivery. Please see below updates and information how to get families booked on ready for summer.

# What is the HAF programme?

Walsall Council is running a Walsall Right for Children Summer Holiday Activities and Food Programme (funded through the Department for Education). This programme will provide free activities including free meals for children ages 5 – 16 years old who receive income related free school meals or on a plan across Walsall, over easter, summer and Christmas holidays.

# What is the Summer Offer?

Booking activities will go live from the 3<sup>rd of</sup> July 2023. If the family you are working with has already registered, they will not need to register again they will just need to book their activities from the 3<sup>rd of</sup> July. Once the child is registered, they will be able to book a maximum of <u>4 week of activities</u> choosing from the below offer.

Offer 1 A Holiday Club, providing a range of activities throughout the week for children/young people to attend, including a healthy meal. The children/young people will attend the same setting for four days for a minimum of four hours per day.

#### OR

Offer 2 A Pick and Mix/ Family Activity, a different activity each day, including a healthy meal. Each child/young person will be able to choose up to four Pick and Mix sessions per week. We aim to target teenagers as well as young people on these sessions; we have a range of activities including bowling, roller skating, swimming and arts and crafts.

How to families register for our FREE Summer Holiday Activities and Food Programme? Each child will receive a letter in the post, or they can contact us for their unique code via our helpline or email. Once families have a child unique code they can either register online via the <a href="HAF">HAF</a> portal

# Absences for appointments and religious observance

May I remind parents/carers, as per the <u>Attendance Policy</u>, the below process for absences relating to appointments during the school day:

- Medical appointments should be arranged outside of school time wherever possible
- The school must be notified a minimum of 3 days in advance of any medical appointment that have been made. Without this prior notification and proof of the appointment, the absence will be marked as unauthorised
- This notification should be sent to <a href="mailto:absences@qmgs.merciantrust.org.uk">absences@qmgs.merciantrust.org.uk</a> with a copy of the appointment notification
- If you are attending the appointment from school you are required to collect your child from
   Reception and sign them out using the Exeat Book, you will need to sign them back in on their return
- If the appointment is before school you are required to accompany your child back into school and sign the Exeat Book
- Parents are not allowed to drive onto the school site, please park off site legally and with consideration for local residents
- Parents need to ensure that their child is aware of what time he/she is being collected. The student
  will be responsible for making their way to Reception so that they are ready for collection when you
  arrive to sign them out.
- If you require some absence for the purpose of religious observance, please complete and return the form which is available on the school website via this <a href="link">link</a>
