



Queen Mary's Grammar School A message from the Headmaster, July 2023

First word

It is with a sense of pride and satisfaction that we find ourselves at the end of the academic year. It has been one filled full of incredible achievements and so much opportunity. The inspection outcome is clearly a highlight of the year, and validation of what we are doing, but it is in the sheer range of activities and experiences that I have found the most fulfilling. Seeing the students on School's <u>Twitter</u> account currently in south-east Asia makes me envious, but also completes the return of the QM experience that we have been building towards for the past two years, since the lifting of public health conditions. I am incredibly grateful to all the staff who have made these opportunities possible and who continue to provide a first-class educational experience for our students.

The end of the summer term is, inevitably, a time for staff farewells and we say goodbye to four influential members of staff. Mr Hitchin leaves after 3 years as head of PE to start a new role at Newcastle under Lyme School. Mr Hitchin has worked hard to raise standards in PE, by innovating on curriculum (including the introduction of GCSE PE) and expanding the extra-curricular activities. It was clear at the sports awards evening last week that the performances of the various teams are at an all time high, as is the amount of representation. We wish Mr Hitchin well for his new challenge. Mr Brown joined the school in 2019 as an assistant head and has made a huge impact. He has developed systems and expanded both the pastoral staff and facilities within the school. Mr Brown has delivered consistently high standards and his expectations will leave a real legacy. I have been indebted to his support as a member of the senior leadership team, through the pandemic and beyond. He has contributed widely to the extra-curricular programme, through PE and CCF, and I hope that we will continue to see his involvement, as he moves the short distance to QMHS.

Two members of staff retire this summer, after long and successful spells at QMGS. Mrs Franklin joined the school as a French and Spanish specialist in 2006 and retires as head of these languages this summer. I have always been impressed by the high standards Mrs Franklin has set in the classroom and a large number of students and staff are indebted to her dedication over 17 years at the school. She has led and participated in a wide range of trips and exchanges over her time in the school and has worked incredibly hard to fight the corner for languages against stern competition from STEM subjects. Mr Rockett retires after almost 30 years at QMGS and leaves a huge legacy. In a speech at a staff retirement event, Mr Ridler reflected on how many students Mr Rockett has inspired over the years, many of which have chosen physics as a career route because of his teaching. Mr Rockett was the head of physics and science for many years, before moving to part time in recent years due to family commitments. He is a hugely popular colleague and teacher and we will miss him, although we expect to still see him with a racket in his hand or at staff football. We wish both colleagues a long and happy retirement.

Mental health and wellbeing

The school continues to support staff and students with their wellbeing through the usual communication channels. Litter and parking

I have written regularly in previous newsletters with regards to safe parking, traffic manouvers and general use of the roads around the school. I have continue to receive regualr communications from parents and local residents about this matter and urge you to please consider other members of the community. We are continuing to work with the local council and police, to ensure a presence and intervention around peak traffic times. Can I also please ask that parents are students are mindful of litter in the community, both in the school grounds and around the local area. We are a busy school, but can make a difference if everyone plays their part.

Absences for appointments and religious observance

May I remind parents/carers, as per the <u>Attendance Policy</u>, the below process for absences relating to appointments during the school day:

- Medical appointments should be arranged outside of school time wherever possible
- The school must be notified a minimum of 3 days in advance of any medical appointment that have been made. Without this prior notification and proof of the appointment, the absence will be marked as unauthorised
- This notification should be sent to <u>absences@qmgs.merciantrust.org.uk</u> with a copy of the appointment notification
- If you are attending the appointment from school you are required to collect your child from Reception and sign them out using the Exeat Book, you will need to sign them back in on their return
- If the appointment is before school you are required to accompany your child back into school and sign the Exeat Book
- Parents are not allowed to drive onto the school site, please park off site legally and with consideration for local residents
- Parents need to ensure that their child is aware of what time he/she is being collected. The student will be responsible for making their way to Reception so that they are ready for collection when you arrive to sign them out.
- If you require some absence for the purpose of religious observance, please complete and return the form which is available on the school website via this <u>link</u>

Summer Holiday Activities Programme (HAF) from Walsall Council

Walsall Council are currently in the planning stage of our HAF summer delivery. This programme will provide free activities including free meals for children ages 5 – 16 years old who receive income related free school meals or on a plan across Walsall, over easter, summer and Christmas holidays.

What is the Summer Offer?

Booking activities went live from the 3^{rd of} July 2023. If the family you are working with has already registered, they will not need to register again they will just need to book their activities from the 3^{rd of} July. Once the child is registered, they will be able to book a maximum of <u>4 week of activities</u> choosing from the below offer.

- 1. A Holiday Club, providing a range of activities throughout the week for children/young people to attend, including a healthy meal. The children/young people will attend the same setting for four days for a minimum of four hours per day. **OR**
- 2. Offer 2 A Pick and Mix/ Family Activity, a different activity each day, including a healthy meal. Each child/young person will be able to choose up to four Pick and Mix sessions per week. We aim to target teenagers as well as young people on these sessions; we have a range of activities including bowling, roller skating, swimming and arts and crafts.

How to families register for our FREE Summer Holiday Activities and Food Programme?

Each child will receive a letter in the post, or they can contact us for their unique code via our helpline or email. Once families have a child unique code they can either register online via the <u>HAF portal</u>


