
Burns Night Sat 27 Jan 2024 QM Arts Festival TBC July 2024

Welfare and Support (Mrs Youngman)

At Queen Mary's we want every student to reach their potential and participate fully as valued members of our community irrespective of background or family circumstance. To ensure the right support was being put in place, we opened the doors of the Welfare Hub in September 2020 and in June 2023, we set up the new Community Hub. Avenues of Support

Queen Mary's Foundation Support Bursary

Queen Mary's prides itself in having a wide range of co-curricular opportunities which is a crucial part of our ethos. We would like all students to be able to take part in these but are acutely aware that there are many families who may struggle to afford these opportunities open to their child. Therefore, we have recently launched the *Queen Mary's Foundation Support Bursary* which works on a 3-tier system.

If your child was under the umbrella of Free school meals or Pupil Premium in Year 11, we would encourage them to apply for the 16-19 bursary if they haven't.

Home - School Communications

Please be aware that we have introduced a new protocol on home - school communications. In order to help manage their workload and to establish reasonable expectations of communication, staff are not expected to respond routinely to emails outside of School hours. It is our aim to respond to all emails within two School days of receipt. Reception staff will also follow this same protocol when dealing with any telephone enquiries. They will take a message, the name of the caller, and contact details and pass that enquiry on to the relevant member of staff, who will aim to respond within two School days.

The only exception to this protocol is if your enquiry relates to an urgent safeguarding concern. In this case, telephone calls will be put through to the safeguarding team or please contact Graham Collins, our Designated Safeguarding Lead, via amagesafeguarding@qmgs.merciantrust.org.uk. Alternatively, please call Walsall MASH on 0300 555 2866.

We would also remind all visitors and callers to the school that we will ensure that our School is a safe place for pupils, staff, and all members of the Queen Mary's community. Harassment, abusive, threatening, or violent behaviour will not be tolerated in any form. We remain committed to ensuring that lines of communication between home and school are as effective and as open as possible and we welcome contact from parents, as we know that an effective home-school partnership is the best way of supporting all our pupils to thrive.

Green Bus and alternative transport options

Speech and Language Screener - Year 7 (Mrs Youngman)

After half term **all** year 7 will be undertaking an online speech and language screener which is being overseen by the Mercian Trust's Speech and Language team. The screener is an online tool that all Mercian Trust schools are using this academic year to help identify any Year 7 students with Speech and Language challenges.

The Mercian trust have decided to roll this out for all Year 7 students to undertake as the development of language skills does not stop at the end of primary school. Students continue to learn new vocabulary, understand more complex language and use their talking for a wider range of purposes into and beyond Key Stage 3.

The importance of good understanding and functional communication skills are well recognised as essential for literacy development, academic success and enabling students to engage with both the curriculum and their peers. However, difficulties with language can be hard to identify lead to language and communications needs being missed or misidentified. The screening tool will help us to identify any student who may need additional support moving forward.

QMGS Breakfast Club (Mrs Hill)

The breakfast club, in partnership with the National Schools Breakfast Programme, offers free bagels and spreads every morning from 8am until 8.30am in the Canteen - all pupils welcome! WellComm Secondary Screener - research project - volunteers wanted (Mrs Youngman)

Sandwell and West Birmingham NHS trust are in the process of developing a Secondary age language screening tool to follow on from the Wellcomm Primary Screen.

Their aim is to create a language screen that can be used in secondary education settings to help identify difficulties with pupils' language skills. For this screen to be developed, it is necessary to carry out a research study to validate and standardise the language screen that has been written.

For this to happen, the WellComm Secondary research team (Speech and Language Therapists and Speech and Language Therapy students) would like to try out the new language screen and standardised language assessments with secondary age participants from local schools. They approached Queen Mary's Grammar School and asked for a selection of students from all year groups to take part in the research project.

The student can be between age 11 and 16 and whom English is their most frequently spoken language. Phases 1 and 2 have already been completed and so our students will be involved in phase 3 and 4. More information can be found here. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ifN-MyQrs80

The screening tool would take approximately 20-25 minutes to complete, and the language assessment will take approximately 45 minutes to complete.

Therefore, we are looking for student volunteers to take part in this research project to help develop the secondary screening tool. Walsall Reflexions are excited to share with you that we are hosting another Craft n Chat event in the October Half Term on Tuesday 31st October 2023. This is a free event for children of all ages.

Holiday Activity and Food programme (HAF) - Walsall Council

HAF is a free programme for children and young people. It runs over Easter, Summer and Christmas school holidays. Your child is eligible if they are:

- aged 5 to 16
- eligible for benefit-related free school meals

We work with providers to develop an exciting and enriching programme of activities. These include schools, local voluntary and community groups, childcare providers and local businesses.

Programme aims:

We want children who attend this provision to:

- eat healthily over the school holidays
- be active during the school holidays take part in activities which support their development and wider educational attainment
- be safe and not to be socially isolated
- have a greater knowledge of health and nutrition
- be more engaged with school and other local services

We also want to ensure that the families who take part in this programme:

- develop their understanding of nutrition and food budgeting
- are signposted towards other information and support, for example, health, employment, and education



Litter and parking

I have written regularly in previous newsletters with regards to safe parking, traffic manouvers and general use of the roads around the school. I have continue to receive regular communications from parents and local residents about this matter and urge you to please consider other members of the community. We are continuing to work with the local council and police, to ensure a presence and intervention around peak traffic times. A red line has been placed at the entrance to the flats at the corner of Princes Avenue and Sutton Road; parents (and others collecting pupils by vehicle) must not cross this line under any circumstances. There has been a recent increase in encroachments by parents etc. on to this private property along with highly inconvenient parking at the main entrance to the flats, located in Princes Avenue near to the junction with Sutton Road. Can I also please ask that parents are students are mindful of litter in the community, both in the school grounds and around the local area? We are a busy school, but can make a difference if everyone plays their part.

Absences for appointments and religious observance

May I remind parents/carers, as per the <u>Attendance Policy</u>, the below process for absences relating to appointments during the school day:

- Medical appointments should be arranged outside of school time wherever possible
- The school must be notified a minimum of 3 days in advance of any medical appointment that have been made. Without this prior notification and proof of the appointment, the absence will be marked as unauthorised
- This notification should be sent to <u>absences@qmgs.merciantrust.org.uk</u> with a copy of the appointment notification
- If you are attending the appointment from school you are required to collect your child from Reception and sign them out using the Exeat Book, you will need to sign them back in on their return
- If the appointment is before school you are required to accompany your child back into school and sign the Exeat Book
- Parents are not allowed to drive onto the school site, please park off site legally and with consideration for local residents
- Parents need to ensure that their child is aware of what time he/she is being collected. The student will be responsible for making their way to Reception so that they are ready for collection when you arrive to sign them out.
- If you require some absence for the purpose of religious observance, please complete and return the form which is available on the school website via this link
