



Queen Mary's Grammar School A message from the Headmaster, December 2023

First word

I write this at the start of the last week of term, which seems this year to be later than ever! We welcomed back our 2023 Year 13 leavers on Monday evening to present their prizes, whilst on Wednesday the main hall will be full of parents and performers for the Christmas concert. If the performances in assemblies are anything to go by, we are in for a treat.

It's been a busy month, with trips and visits going out right up to the end of term: A-level DT students at Morgan motors, Year 7 artists at Wolverhampton art gallery, CCF cadets at Farchynys and Year 8 English students at Harry Potter world. I am grateful for the staff who have made these activities (and lots more besides) happen. As a school, we have supported the Glebe centre's foodbank initiative this term, along with celebrating the 'Save the Children' Christmas jumper day. Along with our other charity work (Birmingham Children's Hospital, Movember and others), we try and live by our motto of giving.

We say goodbye to five colleagues at the end of term. Mrs Xia is leaving to become head of Mandarin at BVGS and goes with our best wishes after two years. I am grateful to her for her commitment to the MEP and for accompanying the Year 10 trip to China in October. Mr Smith leaves his position as SSI in the CCF to take up another role within the cadet training team. He has been with us since 2021 and has worked really effectively to help restore the full offering of the contingent since the Covid restrictions. Mrs Longdon is moving on from her position as the admissions, outreach and partnerships officer after three years. She has been instrumental in growing our primary school outreach work and in setting up the partnership with the other Midlands grammar schools for one entrance exam across the region. Mrs Wilcox is also leaving after three years to join the exams team at Aldridge School, after being the exams officer here. Her work during a difficult few years through, and just after, the pandemic has been greatly appreciated. Finally, Mrs Hopkinson is moving on from her role in managing the sports store, which she has done for almost a decade. She has worked with a large number of parents and students in that time and I know how grateful people have been for her support. We wish all colleagues well for their future endeavours.

The QMA present Burns Night – Saturday 27th January

Thank you to everyone who made the Taste of the World event in December such a success. We are delighted to announce that the event (and associated raffle) made a profit of £6000 towards the Future Sports project. We are delighted to invite you to the next event in the Queen Mary's Association fundraising calendar: Burns Night. The event will take place on Saturday 27th January 2024 from 6.30pm until midnight.

Burns Night is an adult only, formal evening of first-class dining and live music. We also offer a casino experience and a raffle on the night, with all money raised going to support the work of the QMA, our parent's association. Burns Night always proves to be an enjoyable and entertaining event providing an opportunity for guests to socialise with family and friends, as well as to meet other parents and friends of the school.



Tickets are £45 per person and include a formal dinner, welcome drink and entertainment. Numbers will be limited, so we would recommend you buy your tickets as soon as possible via this Ticket source <u>link.</u>

As with each of the three annual QMA events, we are also holding a Pupil Raffle. Please look out for further information and this will be available via Parent Mail from 8th January. There will also be a non-uniform day on Tuesday 23rd January 2024 for those who purchase raffle tickets or make a donation of £2.

All of the money generated through sales of raffle tickets, the non-uniform and cultural dress day and profits from the Burns Night event, raise vital funds for the school which ultimately benefit many of your children. Previous fundraising events have enabled the school to purchase a minibus, erect outdoor cricket nets, install cricket covers and have recently facilitated a refurbishment of the Library.

As in 2022-23, the QMA are supporting the School's <u>Future Sport @ QMGS campaign</u>. £20,000 was donated in the summer and we hope to match that

this year across our QMA events. We hope that you can support the valuable work of the QMA by attending the QMA events and purchasing raffle tickets, so that we can continue to enrich our children's school experience. Queen Mary's Foundation Support Bursary

Litter and parking

I have written regularly in previous newsletters with regards to safe parking, traffic manouvers and general use of the roads around the school. I have continue to receive regular communications from parents and local residents about this matter and urge you to please consider other members of the community. We are continuing to work with the local council and police, to ensure a presence and intervention around peak traffic times. A red line has been placed at the entrance to the flats at the corner of Princes Avenue and Sutton Road; parents (and others collecting pupils by vehicle) must not cross this line under any circumstances. There has been a recent increase in encroachments by parents etc. on to this private property along with highly inconvenient parking at the main entrance to the flats, located in Princes Avenue near to the junction with Sutton Road. Holiday Activity and Food programme (HAF) – Walsall Council

HAF is a free programme for children and young people. It runs over Easter, Summer and Christmas school holidays. Your child is eligible if they are:

- aged 5 to 16
- eligible for benefit-related free school meals

We work with providers to develop an exciting and enriching programme of activities. These include schools, local voluntary and community groups, childcare providers and local businesses.

Programme aims:

We want children who attend this provision to:

- eat healthily over the school holidays
- be active during the school holidays take part in activities which support their development and wider educational attainment
- be safe and not to be socially isolated
- have a greater knowledge of health and nutrition
- be more engaged with school and other local services

We also want to ensure that the families who take part in this programme:

- develop their understanding of nutrition and food budgeting
- are signposted towards other information and support, for example, health, employment, and education
