A message from the Headmaster, February 2024

#### First word

Social mobility been a central focus of the school over the past 5 years, to broaden our reach to more communities and to ensure that children can make the most of their time in the school. I have written regularly about the support mechanisms in place and include details again in this newsletter. As part of the Future Sport project, we are also working with a range of community partners and charities, to ensure that more people from the local community can benefit from the school's facilities. I am delighted to include details on page 2 of the Holiday Activity Fund scheme we are hosting, in partnership with Walsall FC, during the first week of the Easter holiday. I encourage any family who qualifies for free school meals to investigate this and sign up.

February has been a busy month and saw a group of 70 staff and students in Austria for the annual ski trip. The feedback I have received has been extremely positive and I hope that all involved had a great time. We enjoyed the soloists' concert (just before half term) and some of these musicians have been entertaining us in school assemblies over the past couple of weeks. The Spring concert take place on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March and promises to be a great occasion. Future Sport @ QMGS: Working together to raise the funds through the Great Birmingham Run 5th May As I have spoken about at various events and in monthly newsletters, we are working hard towards our <a href="FutureSports">FutureSports</a> @ QMGS project. We have just over £700,000 in pledges and are holding a series of alumni events in the Spring term to raise awareness. All monies raised by the Queen Mary's Association (through events such as Taste of the World and Burns Night) are also going towards the project.

I am delighted to announce our next initiative: to have as many QMGS runners in the various events at the Great Birmingham Run on 5<sup>th</sup> May 2024

- The two main runs are a 10k and a half marathon. Minimum age restrictions are: runners aged 15+ (10k) and 17+ (Half marathon).
- There is a <u>Juniors & Mini run</u> on the same day, starting slightly earlier. The Mini is for those aged 3-8 and they run a 1.5km dash, while Junior runners (aged 9-15) run a 2.5km sprint.
- Runners will need to register individually via the Birmingham run website

Great Birmingham Run has partnered with Enthuse for fundraising and will be connecting the QMA to this so that all QM runners can raise sponsorship for the event. We would like to aim for 50 runners from across the staff, alumni, parent and student body and a combined total of £20,000.

At Queen Mary's we want every student to reach their potential and participate fully as valued members of our community irrespective of background or family circumstance. To ensure the right support was being put in place, we opened the doors of the Welfare Hub in September 2020 and in June 2023, we set up the new Community Hub. #### Queen Mary's Foundation Support Bursary

Queen Mary's prides itself in having a wide range of co-curricular opportunities which is a crucial part of our ethos. We would like all students to be able to take part in these but are acutely aware that there are many families who may struggle to afford these opportunities open to their child. Therefore, we have recently launched the *Queen Mary's Foundation Support Bursary* which works on a 3-tier system.

#### **Queen Mary's Association**

The QMA are supporting the School's <u>Future Sport @ QMGS campaign</u>. £20,000 was donated in the summer and we are continuing to support the campaign this year across our QMA events. The Taste of the World event in December was a tremendous success, raising around £6000 and with almost 400 people in attendance. 200 people attended the Burns night ball in January and the event made a fantastic £5000 profit. We hope that you can support the valuable work of the QMA by attending the QMA events and purchasing raffle tickets, so that we can continue to enrich our children's school experience. Clive Mark has now taken over the management of sportswear, as well as school uniform. All uniform and sportswear is available via their <u>website</u> and in the Walsall branch. We are also working with Clive Mark on their 'reform' programme, to recycle and re-use school uniform. If you have any uniform or sports wear in good condition, you can bring this into school and deposit in the box in main reception. If this is bagged and labelled with your name and details, you can receive a 10% voucher off future purchases. The items will be then made available to families in need.
