Future Sport @ QMGS: Working together to raise the funds through the Great Birmingham Run 5th May

As I have spoken about at various events and in monthly newsletters, we are working hard towards our <u>Future</u> <u>Sports @ QMGS project.</u> We have just over £700,000 in pledges and are holding a series of alumni events in the Spring term to raise awareness. All monies raised by the Queen Mary's Association (through events such as Taste of the World and Burns Night) are also going towards the project.

I am delighted to announce our next initiative: to have as many QMGS runners in the various events at the Great Birmingham Run on 5<sup>th</sup> May 2024

- The two main runs are a 10k and a half marathon. Minimum age restrictions are: runners aged 15+ (10k) and 17+ (Half marathon).
- There is a <u>Juniors & Mini run</u> on the same day, starting slightly earlier. The Mini is for those aged 3-8 and they run a 1.5km dash, while Junior runners (aged 9-15) run a 2.5km sprint.
- Runners will need to register individually via the Birmingham run website

Great Birmingham Run has partnered with Enthuse for fundraising and will be connecting the QMA to this so that all QM runners can raise sponsorship for the event. We would like to aim for 50 runners from across the staff, alumni, parent and student body and a combined total of £20,000.

# Personal safety of students

I am conscious of a number of stories in the press at the minute of issues around the country, related to young people and their personal safety. Sad events in Birmingham, Bristol and London bring home some of the challenges that young people face, and we are keen to make sure that students at QMGS are safe, when they are out of school, including travelling to and from home during the week. We have had matters reported to us of the experiences of students at the end of the school day, off the school site, involving members of the public.

It is advisable that the students look to avoid travelling long distances alone and be vigilant about people around them (it is noticeable that a lot of school age children often walk around wearing headphones or looking at phones). If students do feel unsafe, they should apply the principle of 'run, hide, tell', making sure they distance themselves from any trouble and communicating with both family and school. Similarly, if anything of a threatening nature is posted on social media, they should tell a trusted adult. Finally, may I remind all members of the school community that students should not carry any form of weapon for self-protection? We have a strict rule in school for anything that is brought onto site, and it is illegal for such things to be carried in a public place. Please do speak to us if you have any concerns.

## Welfare and Support (Mrs Youngman)

At Queen Mary's we want every student to reach their potential and participate fully as valued members of our community irrespective of background or family circumstance. To ensure the right support was being put in place, we opened the doors of the Welfare Hub in September 2020 and in June 2023, we set up the new Community Hub. ## Avenues of Support

As the cost of living continues to impact families daily, the school has worked hard to ensure there are a range of avenues of support for those families that require additional methods of support. We also know that though education is free of charge at Queen Mary's, there are still indirect costs involved in your child's education that we may be able to support with via the *Financial Assistance* support. ## Queen Mary's Foundation Support Bursary

Queen Mary's prides itself in having a wide range of co-curricular opportunities which is a crucial part of our ethos. We would like all students to be able to take part in these but are acutely aware that there are many families who may struggle to afford these opportunities open to their child. Therefore, we have recently launched the *Queen Mary's Foundation Support Bursary* which works on a 3-tier system.

#### Mental health and wellbeing

The school continues to support staff and students with their wellbeing through the usual communication channels. We work with a number of organisations and any member of the school community can raise concerns via the wellbeing or safeguarding email addresses. These will be checked during the holiday, but there may be some delay in response.
