

Is your child a young carer? (Mrs Hill)

We are proud of being a diverse and inclusive school and strive to support our pupils and their families in any way we can. As we continue to develop our support, we have been improving our knowledge and understanding of young carers. Therefore, we would be interested to learn if your child helps to give ongoing care and emotional support for you or other members of your family who may have an illness, a physical/mental disability or a mental health issue. With your help, we are looking to gather more information to help us identify and support any of our pupils who have a caring role at home and therefore could be considered a young carer. We have been conducting assemblies which have raised the awareness of young carers and asked pupils to reach out to us if they think this applies to them so we can try to ensure the right support is given to them. Since doing this we have identified 16 young carers but know that it is a small part of a much bigger picture.

Please follow this link to help you decide if your child might be a young carer. If you think they are, please email Mrs D Hill, Young Carer's Operational Lead d.hill@qmgs.merciantrust.org.uk with the heading 'Young Carer'. Please tell us your child's name and form with a brief overview of the caring role they provide. We will then be in touch with both you and your child to explain how they can be supported here in school (and out of school) and share information about other measures of support available.

Vaccination Clinics (South Locality School Nurses)

Over the next few months family hubs across the borough will be operating vaccination clinics for the MMR vaccine, please see below for further information. Vaccination clinics have been set up in Walsall to ensure children are up to date with their measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine.

Clinics will take place in June and July at Family Hubs across the borough:

- Saturday 29 June, 10:00 14:00, South and Central Hub, Birchills Street, Walsall, WS2 8NF
- Saturday 6 July, 10:00 14:00, North Family Hub, 275 Blakenall Lane, Blakenall, Walsall WS3 1HJ

The clinics will be staffed by trained healthcare professionals from the NHS and Vaccination UK who specialise in childhood vaccinations and follow all necessary safety protocols. Children will need to be accompanied by a parent or guardian at the clinics.

The DTP vaccine, which provides protection against diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis (whooping cough) and the MenACWY vaccine, which helps protect against meningitis and septicaemia (blood poisoning), are also available at these clinics. Both vaccines are given to children aged 13 or 14 (school year 9 or 10).

Parents and guardians of children who have missed or delayed one of these childhood vaccines are being encouraged to come forward. Appointments can be booked by calling 01922 902035.

Catering updates

Our school caters (Impact Food Group) have announced some tariff changes for September and I include a letter below, explaining this. Ahead of September, we will share menu and meal deal information.



Dear Parent/Guardian

IFG proudly serves over 500,000 students nutritious meals each day. Our award-winning teams are dedicated to serving vibrant, appetising food, freshly prepared on site using quality ingredients. To enable us to continue to do this, our **tariff will increase by 2.0%** across our range from September 2024. Below we have outlined some of the cost pressures which have driven this increase.

Food Inflation: As is the case for supermarkets and restaurants across the UK, the rate at which food prices are rising has slowed, however, they remain high. Coupled with climbing fuel costs, we continue to encounter supply chain challenges such as lack of availability and higher prices.

Employee Funding & Retention: In April, the Government increased the minimum wage by 10%, a positive move which will ease cost pressures for many of our colleagues. Alongside this, to retain and attract a high standard of leadership, we have increased wages for supervisory and managerial roles. Despite positive advancements, the combination of these factors means significant ongoing cost demands across our industry, many of which we have absorbed. Our agility has enabled us to avoid an April increase and keep our September increase down to 2.0%, which is notably lower than the current rate of inflation.

We continue to seek ways of reducing these challenges, however, we refuse to compromise on ingredients or service standards. We remain proud to serve a home cooked main meal and dessert, and several alternative meal deal combinations. Additionally, our free porridge provision at breakfast time, meal deals and new 'PowerBites' range at £1.30 are all designed to provide further support and/or more affordable meal options to ensure nutritious food is always accessible. We truly believe we offer students innovative dishes which rival the high street whilst providing families with great value for money.

Through partnering with schools, we continue to see more students enjoying our services. Whilst this is great news and tells us our menus are popular with students, we are always looking to encourage more young people to dine with us. If you have any feedback we would love to hear from you.

We hope you understand our position and your family can continue to enjoy our services. We remain open and honest about our challenges and will continue to seek your input. Should you wish to discuss this letter, or anything else relating to your catering service, please get in touch.

Notice from Walsall council, regarding upcoming road works

We have received the following notification from Walsall council of road works to take place during July, in close vicinity to the school:

Carriageway Resurfacing Work: Total length of Princes Ave from Sutton Rd to Broadway North

Walsall Council is to undertake carriageway resurfacing works at the above location as part of its Highway Maintenance Programme. The works have been planned and organised by the Council's Highways Maintenance Team.

This scheme is being delivered from additional funding provided to Walsall Council by UK Government under its Network North commitment to support highway maintenance across England.

To ensure the safety of our employees and the general public, the above works will be undertaken by using a daytime only road closure. Localised diversion routes will be in operation during the working hours listed below. We will endeavour to maintain access to frontages wherever possible.

The works above Works will be split into two individual phases.

Phase 1: From Sutton Road to The Crescent. Commencing on 8th to 10th July from 8am-4pm.

Phase 2: From The Crescent to Broadway North. Commencing on 11th to 23rd July from 8am-4pm. (no work at the weekend)

We will endeavour to start and complete the works to the above times scales; however, the above dates are subject to change should there be any adverse weather conditions prior to or during the works.

The above works will replace the existing carriageway surface, traffic calming and all associated road markings.

IMPORTANT Whilst the CARRIAGEWAY WORKS are in progress,

please be aware that a temporary 'No Stopping' restriction order will be introduced for the duration of the work, and it is vitally important that the section of road to be resurfaced must be kept clear of vehicles. Temporary signs will be erected indicating the hours during which the 'No Stopping' restriction will be in force. Any vehicle obstructing our works during this period will receive a PENALTY CHARGE NOTICE (PCN) and the vehicle will then be physically removed in accordance with Walsall Council's Vehicle Removal Policy to a nearby location or to our contractor's compound of which a release fee may be payable.

To help the work be delivered swiftly and efficiently we will have dedicated traffic management personnel on site to offer advice to both residents and business on parking and access arrangements. Civil Enforcement Officers will be on site each day to ensure that no vehicles are obstructing our works within the above phases, therefore please be mindful that tickets will be issued from 8am.

Disabled Bays.

Any residents that current have the use of disabled bay outside their property please contact via email.

trafficmanagement@walsall.gov.uk.to ensure that it gets reinstated during our works. Failing do so may result in it not being replaced.

Every effort will be made to ensure noise pollution is kept to a minimum and we ask for your understanding and co-operation to allow the works to be conducted safely. If you have any queries or anticipate any problems that may be caused by these works, please contact Gary Chalk on the above email address.


Litter and parking
