First word

As we reach the end of an extremely busy and productive academic year, I wanted to pay tribute to all the staff who have made such a wide range of opportunities available for the students. The photo montage below, taken from the School's <u>social media</u> accounts, gives a flavour of the international ethos of the School over the past few weeks and I'm sure that these students have found the experiences to be enriching and exhilarating.



Over the past month, we have also seen students showing their generosity of spirit, by being involved in sponsored events. Year 12 mathematicians have raised over £11,000 for Birmingham Children's hospital in their 24-hour challenge and the 72 hour sport-a-thon (see page 3) has raised over £5000 towards the Future Sports campaign. It has been an outstanding year of fundraising for charitable causes and I am proud of the efforts of students and staff.

We always say goodbye to colleagues at this time of year and, in 2024, we pay tribute to three members of teaching staff. Dr Vinuesa Casas leaves us after 2 years in the maths department, to a college closer to home in Warwickshire. I am grateful for his contribution to the School and we wish him well for his future career.

Mrs Sharp has taught Spanish at the School since 2011 and, again, leaves us to pursue opportunities closer to home. She has contributed widely to the co-curricular programme, leading international trips to Spain, Dubai, and Morocco over her time. She has worked tirelessly for the students in her care and has achieved excellent outcomes over time. Mrs Sharp will be missed at the School and she leaves with our best wishes.

Our longest serving staff leaver is Mr Clements, who has taught Biology at QMGS for 19 years. He has displayed an impressive commitment to teaching and learning in that time and has contributed widely to the Biology

department and EPQ programme. He has led a wide range of enrichment opportunities and has contributed to sport, Farchynys and a range of trips, including sports tours overseas and early China visits. Mr Clements became a member of the chartered college of teaching during his time at QMGS and the quality of his teaching will be missed by students, as colleagues will miss the support he provides.

I am speaking to the students this week about making good use of their summer break, using it as an opportunity to relax and re-energize, but also to reflect on the past year and set resolution for what lies ahead. I hope that they find time to read, explore and try new experiences.

Queen Mary's Association (QMA)

We were delighted to see lots of members of the community at the QMA's summer arts festival in June. The event has made around £3500 profit, bringing the total for the year to just under £15,000! The QMA are supporting the School's <u>Future Sport @ QMGS campaign</u>. £20,000 was donated in 2023 and we are continuing to support the campaign this year across our QMA events. Sports Store changes

Clive Mark has now taken over the management of sportswear, as well as school uniform. All uniform and sportswear are available via their <u>website</u> and in the Walsall branch. We are also working with Clive Mark on their 'reform' programme, to recycle and re-use school uniform. If you have any uniform or sports wear in good condition, you can bring this into school and deposit in the box in main reception. If this is bagged and labelled with your name and details, you can receive a 10% voucher off future purchases. The items will be then made available to families in need. You can also take items directly into the Clive Mark store.

Walsall College Future Foodies programme – July and August

Walsall College are running a free 4 day course aimed at 14 to 16 year olds to promote holistic life skills and diet autonomy for young people in the community. The aim is to empower the youth of Walsall to make positive informed lifestyle choices to continue into adulthood, within this course we want students to gain confidence, teamworking skills and organisation skills. Topics covered will include: cooking, budgeting, growing, eco-friendly kitchen tips, making a 'fakeaway' and a chance to cook in a professional kitchen. Future Sport @ QMGS: A community legacy



Is your child a young carer? (Mrs Hill)

We are proud of being a diverse and inclusive school and strive to support our pupils and their families in any way we can. As we continue to develop our support, we have been improving our knowledge and understanding of young carers. Therefore, we would be interested to learn if your child helps to give ongoing care and emotional support for you or other members of your family who may have an illness, a physical/mental disability, or a mental health issue. With your help, we are looking to gather more information to help us identify and support any of our pupils who have a caring role at home and therefore could be considered a young carer.

We have been conducting assemblies which have raised the awareness of young carers and asked pupils to reach out to us if they think this applies to them so we can try to ensure the right support is given to them. Since doing this we have identified 16 young carers but know that it is a small part of a much bigger picture.


