

Farchynys

Farchynys, the school's Welsh Centre, is located on the stunning Mawddach Estuary in southern Snowdonia with views over to Cadair Idris. Purchased for the school in 1963 it has been a centre for adventure and learning in a contrasting setting for the past 50 years.

The centre provides basic self-catering accommodation for up to 24 pupils and accompanying staff in dormitory accommodation, together with classroom and dining room facilities. The school also owns 10 acres of the adjoining headland including its own access onto the estuary.



All year 7 pupils visit

Farchynys in the summer of their first year in a series of trips with other members of their form group. These "Learning to Learn" weeks form an end to the year when pupils learn about learning in other contexts and about working with each other. Typical activities include visits to Harlech Castle, a local slate mine, the Centre for Alternative Technology and creating their own meal one evening.

Combined Cadet Force

The Combined Cadet Force continues to gain in popularity at the school with well over 300 cadets, representing almost half of the school community. The contingent consists of Army and RAF sections of roughly equal size and is one of more than 200 such contingents based in schools throughout the country.

Membership of the contingent is entirely voluntary, with pupils choosing to join when they enter year 9. We also offer a fast-track scheme for newentrants to the sixth-form. Our best cadets are invited to continue their membership whilst in the sixth-form to act as cadet NCOs and undertake

The Combined Cadet Force is a youth organisation which is sponsored by the Ministry of Defence. Its purpose is summarised by the CCF charter, but in essence is about developing our pupils to be full citizens in the future.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

I hope that this letter finds you well and that you have had a good summer. I wanted to write before the beginning of term in order to update you on some key matters.

Beginning of term arrangements

- Mon 2 Sep staff training day (no students in school)
- Tue 3 Sep Year 7 and 12 induction day (see separate instructions for those year groups)
- Wed 4 Sep return to school for all students (school starts at 8.45am)

Summer disorder and return to school

It has been alarming to see the press coverage over the summer of disorder in communities around the UK, including within the Midlands. We are aware that some students (and their families) may have been affected by this and want to make sure that we provide the opportunities to check in and listen to any concerns. Please do speak to your child about talking to staff if they are worried about anything, including during their journeys to and from school. I am proud to lead a school with respect and equality as part of its core CREDIT values and want to emphasise that we take a zero tolerance approach to any form of discrimination or hate speech. I will be talking about this in assemblies at the start of term, along with warnings about the dangers of social media, including misinformation and fake news. As a Home-School partnership, I would be grateful if you could reinforce the same principles.

Attendance requirements

School attendance is a legal requirement. Absence negatively impacts a child's academic potential and performance and denies the opportunity for them to interact socially with their friends and build experiences outside the classroom. All pupils should aim to attend school 100% of the time. Attendance and punctuality have always been monitored but as of September there will be some changes in line with the new <u>mandatory guidelines</u> published by Department for Education. This includes the requirement to share all daily attendance data with the government, new fine rates for absence, details of the thresholds for penalties and a change in attendance codes.


From September, no holiday in term time will be authorised and we are obliged to consider issuing a penalty notice to parents if a child misses 5 days of school for an unauthorised absence. Appropriate levels of challenge and support will be implemented where we recognise a cause for concern. If a child's attendance falls below 90%, they are classed as persistently absent and in turn the school will liaise with the Local Authority and an Education Welfare Officer who can issue legal proceedings where parents/carers are not meeting their legal obligation to ensure their child attends school. Parents can review their child's attendance and punctuality using EduLink. Please contact Mrs Johnson via <u>dataenquiries@qmgs.merciantrust.org.uk</u>, if you are unable to access this system. Our priority will be to take a 'supportfirst', approach to help students and their families if there are barriers to attendance.

Behaviour expectations

We are proud that in March 2023, Ofsted rated our behaviour and attitudes as outstanding, but we are keen to ensure that our exceptional standards are maintained. Atomic habits are the small, seemingly insignificant things which if done consistently lead to positive outcomes. By setting these high standards of behaviour we create an environment that promotes academic excellence and well-being. In line with this, we will be reviewing some changes to our existing rules and sanctions relating to mobile phones and detentions. Any such adjustments will be communicated to parents and included in our behaviour policy.

Dear Parents

We have designed and embedded a curriculum that is planned and sequenced to develop in our highly academic students the knowledge and skills necessary for their future roles in society, while ensuring that the balanced curriculum offer is accessible to all.



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QMGS Curriculum policy A Levels

- A Levels are undoubtedly challenging for all students we want all students to be academically-ambitious
- 3 A level subjects for two years plus an additional academic option
- Exception is Further Maths for those wanting to pursue a relevant degree course (e.g. maths, physics, economics)
- Emphasis is upon choosing the right 3 A Level subjects early on
- Expectation of mentoring/volunteering and participation in extracurricular activities
- Internal Y12 exams in May (8 months away!)
- Influence upon UCAS Predicted Grades
