A message from the Headmaster, October 2024

First word

I am writing this message at the start of the last week of a long half term. We end this week with Speech Day, our annual celebration of the achievements over the past year and a day where we reflect back further, to those people who have been instrumental in making sure that the school has thrived over its 470 year history. We should never take our School for granted and it is important that we all play our part in ensuring that the community thrives.

The sense of community was extremely strong at the Varsity rugby event last week, where hundreds of students, staff and parents watched the under 12s, followed by the senior teams take on Bishop Vesey's Grammar School. The delight on the faces of the Under 12 A and B teams as they ended their games victorious, coupled with the determination of the senior teams in their close games against strong opposition, told a lot about how working together can result in success. The School's <u>social media</u> accounts give a glimpse at the broader extra-curricular life and it is down to the hard work of staff and students that these events happen and that young people thrive. That has happened to many generations of Marians and long may it continue.

As well as sporting successes, we look forward to the performances of musicians at Speech Day, displaying the fruits of their endeavours over many weeks of practice. We also have a student in China (Nishan Siddique of Year 13), representing the UK after winning the national Mandarin speaking competition in the summer term. This is the second year in a row that QMGS has provided the UK entrant and is testament to the hard work and dedication of Mrs Wang and her team. This has been recognised by UCL, who have awarded Mrs Wang a national award of excellence for the teaching and leadership of Mandarin. A fitting accolade for many years of dedication.

Finally, I have been really impressed with students who have spoken in our large key stage assemblies this term. From reflective accounts of international trips, to presentations of iconic figures related to Black History Month and in parental presentations about the experiences of sixth formers in the school, they have shown the best of QMGS. Bright, articulate young people with a clear sense of morals and perspective. We look forward to presentations at Speech Day and on Diwali after the half term break and I wish all families who are celebrating this a wonderful experience.



Is your child a young carer? (Mrs Hill)

We are proud of being a diverse and inclusive school and strive to support our pupils and their families in any way we can. As we continue to develop our support, we have been improving our knowledge and understanding of young carers. Therefore, we would be interested to learn if your child helps to give ongoing care and emotional support for you or other members of your family who may have an illness, a physical/mental disability, or a mental health issue. With your help, we are looking to gather more information to help us identify and support any of our pupils who have a caring role at home and therefore could be considered a young carer.

We have been conducting assemblies which have raised the awareness of young carers and asked pupils to reach out to us if they think this applies to them so we can try to ensure the right support is given to them. Since doing this we have identified 16 young carers but know that it is a small part of a much bigger picture.
