A message from the Headmaster, September 2024

First word

It has been a pleasure to welcome so many parents into school this month, attending the information evenings for Years 7, 10 and 12, along with the RSE presentation. Whether you are a new parent to the school, or returning for another year, I hope that you are well and that you feel informed about what lies ahead. The School website sets out the full range of subjects on offer through our curriculum and the School's social media accounts give a glimpse at the broader extra-curricular life. We have already had sporting and languages success this term and we look forward to another busy year. This followed exam successes from the summer, of which we were very proud.

There have been a number of letters sent to parents since the beginning of the school year and I would encourage you to look at these, if you haven't already done so. I wrote before term started about <u>behavioural and attendance expectations</u> and that we are following tightened DfE guidance. I make no apologies when I say that the students need to be in school as much as possible and would be grateful for your support on this. I will not be able to grant authorised absences in term time, apart from in extreme circumstances. We have also appointed an attendance officer to the school, to work more closely with families where there have been attendance or punctuality issues.

Ms Naguthney also wrote at the beginning of term with regards to changes in some of the <u>behavioural sanctions</u>, including the introduction of same day detentions. It is important that the students learn from this and adhere to the high expectations set out. It is, after all, for their benefit that they develop effective working habits and minimise distraction. These behavioural expectations extend beyond school, including on trips and during their journeys to and from QM. If I may, I would like you to emphasise these expectations.

Finally, I wrote to parents with regards to concerns over driving and parking around the school site. My Senior Leadership Team are on duty outside the school on Sutton Road at the beginning and end of each school day to keep our children safe. Regrettably that job is made difficult due to the dangerous driving and parking of a small but significant number of parents. Similarly, the school regularly receives complaints from our neighbours about inconsiderate parking preventing them from accessing their properties, and from others about the poor standard of driving. We already work with the Local Authority to promote road safety and sustainable travel amongst our students. You should be aware that we proactively invite the police and parking enforcement teams to visit the school at peak times and issue penalties to drivers who are breaking the law. I realise that most parents already drive safely and considerately. As we enter the darker winter months it is important that this situation is addressed.

Annual parent survey

Thank you to those parents who filled in the survey in the summer term. Most respondents agreed or strongly agreed with all questions, representing a strong endorsement for the work of the school. We will be following up on specific feedback and wanted to make the following points:

- Some parents asked if we could return to in-person parents' evenings. This would be extremely difficult, with larger year groups, without significantly adding to the workload of staff. We have had very positive feedback from most parents on the convenience and efficiency of the system and have tried to provide in-person information events at the start of Key Stages 3, 4 and 5.
- A small minority of parents disagreed that they weren't informed about what their child was learning
 and or what opportunities there were. Please refer to the <u>curriculum page</u> of the website and look out

QM Experience Fund and the Future Sport Project

Thank you to those parents who have made donations to the QM Experience fund, following my <u>letter</u> at the beginning of term. We try our best to provide extra-curricular activities through our school budget or at as low a cost as possible. However, our ambitions often go beyond this income and I am hoping that you will consider giving a regular amount to ensure that we can continue to offer a full range of activities. Prior to the Covid pandemic, we ran the *'Lift Fund'* and I am grateful to those of you who supported this. Over the past few years, I have been very conscious of the national economic picture and have been cautious about approaching parents for support. However, I am grateful to those who have given what they can to the school and who have supported events through the Queen Mary's Association (QMA).

For the past two years, we have been fundraising towards the <u>Future Sport @ QMGS project</u>: an ambitious initiative to revolutionise our facilities for the benefit of our students and the wider community. We are very close to receiving planning permission and, with pledges standing just below £1million, we are hoping to start the development this year. Any donations to the QM experience fund will initially go towards this but will support a wide range of other opportunities once we have completed the project.

I hope that you will seriously consider making a regular payment to the QM Experience Fund. Sports Store changes

Clive Mark has now taken over the management of sportswear, as well as school uniform. All uniform and sportswear are available via their <u>website</u> and in the Walsall branch. We are also working with Clive Mark on their 'reform' programme, to recycle and re-use school uniform. If you have any uniform or sportswear in good condition, you can bring this into school and deposit in the box in main reception. If this is bagged and labelled with your name and details, you can receive a 10% voucher off future purchases. The items will be then made available to families in need. You can also take items directly into the Clive Mark store.

Is your child a young carer? (Mrs Hill)

We are proud of being a diverse and inclusive school and strive to support our pupils and their families in any way we can. As we continue to develop our support, we have been improving our knowledge and understanding of young carers. Therefore, we would be interested to learn if your child helps to give ongoing care and emotional support for you or other members of your family who may have an illness, a physical/mental disability, or a mental health issue. With your help, we are looking to gather more information to help us identify and support any of our pupils who have a caring role at home and therefore could be considered a young carer.

We have been conducting assemblies which have raised the awareness of young carers and asked pupils to reach out to us if they think this applies to them so we can try to ensure the right support is given to them. Since doing this we have identified 16 young carers but know that it is a small part of a much bigger picture.
