A message from the Headmaster, December 2025

First word

I am writing this at the start of the final week of term before Christmas. Over the next couple of days, we will welcome back our Year 13 leavers from the summer for their prize giving and we are hosting the Christmas concert. It's a busy week, at the end of a busy and highly productive term, one filled with experiences and accomplishments.

There have been some excellent sporting achievements, with students competing well in rugby, hockey, netball and basketball. In rugby alone, 133 fixtures have been played, with a win ratio of almost 50% against some very tough opposition and the Year 10s winning the Greater Birmingham championship. It is great to see students in Year 7 flourishing in new sports that



they hadn't played a matter of months ago (above) and I am grateful to all the staff, across all sports, who have given up so much time for practices and fixtures. Full details of the sports fixtures coming up can be found [here](#).

There have also been a wide variety of trips and activities, with Year 10-13 French students travelling across the channel to the Christmas markets in Lille (above) and sixth formers taking part in the 'Lessons from Auschwitz' programme in Poland. A number of trips have taken place in the UK, with cadets at Farchynys, DT students at Morgan Motors, Year 7 artists at Wolverhampton Art Gallery, Year 12s at Cambridge University and those studying the Latin option in the sixth form visiting Bath. The senior mathematicians won the regional heat of the senior maths challenge and the Chess team finished 3rd in the Midlands final; both sets of students qualifying for the national round in their respective competitions. Finally, a team of Year 11 and 12 students (right) finished third in the regional Bar Mock Trial competition, performing exceptionally well and showing the value of dedicated preparation.



Thank you to all members of the community who attended the Taste of the World event and made it such a success. We sold 400 tickets, and it is looking like we will have made a profit of around £7000, which will help support projects in school. We are hugely grateful to all members of the committee who supported the event, our performers and the caterers (Five Rivers, Chef Vijay and Innovate). The student raffle has been drawn, and all prize winners have been notified. Please see below about how to support our next event 'Burns Night' in January.

The Mandarin Excellence Programme students closed the Taste of the World event and have been working hard this term on their studies, and enrichment activities (right). 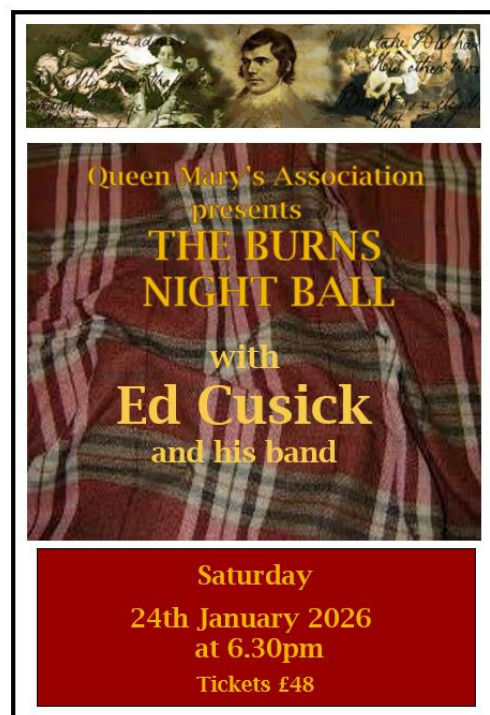
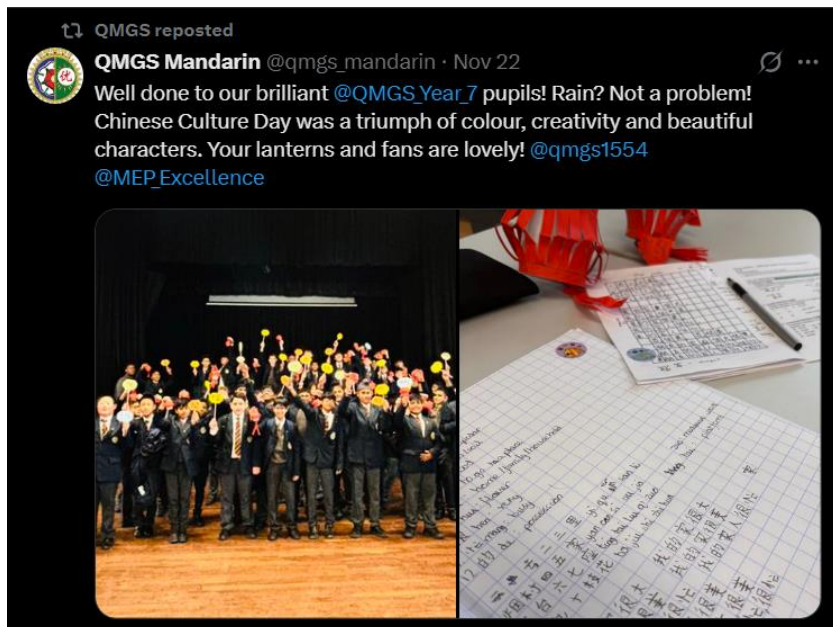
The Queen Mary's Association (QMA) present Burns Night

We are delighted to invite you an exciting event in the Queen Mary's Association fundraising calendar: Burns Night. The event will take place on Saturday 24th January 2026 from 6.30pm until midnight.

Burns Night is an adult only, formal evening of first-class dining and live music. We also offer a casino experience and a raffle on the night, with all money raised going to support the work of the QMA, our parent's association. Burns Night always proves to be an enjoyable and entertaining event providing an opportunity for guests to socialise with family and friends, as well as to meet other parents and friends of the school. Tickets are £48 per person and include a formal dinner, welcome drink and entertainment. All of the money generated from profits of the night and events in school including sales of raffle tickets and a non-uniform day, raise vital funds for the school which ultimately benefit many of our children.

Previous fundraising events have enabled the school to purchase a minibus, install cricket nets and covers and



also a refurbishment of the Library. Last year we provided funds to support teacher-led initiatives such as the refurbishment of the Welfare Hub extension, which allows the school to provide targeted pastoral support to students. This year, we continue to support individual projects as well as supporting the School's Future Sports @ QMGs project. The last event held in January 2025 raised over £5,000 with a large proportion of that figure being made up from proceeds from raffles; we need your help to match or even surpass that this year! We hope that you can support the valuable work of the QMA by attending Burns Night and purchasing raffle tickets available on the night, so that we can continue to enrich our children's school experience.

We are always looking for support in the running of the events, but also in the donation of raffle/tombola prizes, business sponsorship, and match funding. QM Experience Fund and the Future Sport programme

I wrote to all parents at the start of term about our 2025-26 QM Experience Fund. A large number of people have already made a contribution to this since the start of term in September, and I hope that all parents can consider a donation this year. Whether it is through sport, music, drama, language learning or one of the many other extra-curricular activities, we hope that your child will make the absolute most of the QM experience in their time with us.

We try our best to provide these activities through our school budget or at as low a cost as possible. However, our ambitions often go beyond this income, and I am hoping that you will consider giving a regular amount to ensure that we can continue to offer a full range of activities. We launched the QM Experience Fund last year and received a tremendous response, raising over £10,000 in 2024-25. Added to just under £20,000 raised through the QMA events, this was a terrific boost to the school from the parental/student body and has made a genuine difference to what we can achieve.

As I have written to you about previously, over the past three years, we have been fundraising towards the [Future Sport @ QMGS project](#): an ambitious initiative to revolutionise our facilities for the benefit of our students and the wider community. Any donations to the QM experience fund will initially go towards this but will support a wide range of other opportunities once we have completed the project.

We have almost completed the astro-turf development (right) and we hope to be able to use this from late January. Work then proceeds on the natural turf pitches, which should be seeded by the end of the Spring. We still have significant fundraising to do for phase 3 (the refurbishment and extension of the pavilion) and would be grateful for any support. I hope that you will seriously consider making a regular payment to the QM Experience Fund. We are grateful for a regular contribution as it enables us to plan the best ways in which to support our young people. Is your child a young carer? Let us know (Mrs Hill)

We are proud of being a diverse and inclusive school and strive to support our pupils and their families in any way we can. As we continue to develop our support, we have been improving our knowledge and understanding of young carers. Therefore, we would be interested to learn if your child helps to give ongoing care and emotional support for you or other members of your family who may have an illness, a physical/mental disability or a mental health issue. With your help, we are looking to gather more information to help us identify and support any of our pupils who have a caring role at home and therefore could be considered a young carer. We have had assemblies to raise awareness of young carers and asked pupils to reach out to us if they think this applies to them so that we can try to ensure the right support is given to them. Since doing this we have identified over 30 young carers but know that it is a small part of a much bigger picture.
