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

Farchynys

Farchynys, the school's Welsh Centre, is located on the stunning Mawddach Estuary in southern Snowdonia with views over to Cadair Idris. Purchased for the school in 1963 it has been a centre for adventure and learning in a contrasting setting for the past 50 years.

The centre provides basic self-catering accommodation for up to 24 pupils and accompanying staff in dormitory accommodation, together with classroom and dining room facilities. The school also owns 10 acres of the adjoining headland including its own access onto the estuary.



All year 7 pupils visit Farchynys in the summer of their first year in a series of trips with other members of their form group. These 'Learning to Learn' weeks form an end to the year when pupils learn about learning in other contexts and about working with each other. Typical activities include visits to Harlech Castle, a local slate mine, the Centre for Alternative Technology and creating their own meal one evening.



Combined Cadet Force



the majority of the instruction of other cadets.

The Combined Cadet Force continues to gain in popularity at the school with well over 300 cadets, representing almost half of the school community. The contingent consists of Army and RAF sections of roughly equal size and is one of more than 200 such contingents based in schools throughout the country.

Membership of the contingent is entirely voluntary, with pupils choosing to join when they enter year 9. We also offer a fast-track scheme for new-entrants to the sixth-form. Our best cadets are invited to continue their membership whilst in the sixth-form to act as cadet NCOs and undertake

The Combined Cadet Force is a youth organisation which is sponsored by the Ministry of Defence. Its purpose is summarised by the CCF charter, but in essence is about developing our pupils to be full citizens in the future.

Attendance requirements

School attendance is a legal requirement. Absence negatively impacts a child's academic potential and performance and denies them the opportunity to interact socially with their peers and build experiences beyond the classroom. All pupils should aim to attend school 100% of the time. Attendance and punctuality continue to be monitored rigorously and as of September, we will maintain the approach introduced last academic year, in line with the [mandatory guidelines](#) published by the Department for Education.

- We daily share our attendance data with the Department for Education.
- Updated fine rates for unauthorised absence.
- Clear thresholds for penalty notices.
- Clear support and challenge to address any punctuality issues.

Term-time holidays will not be authorised. We are obliged to consider issuing a penalty notice to parents if a child misses five days of school due to unauthorised absence. Where attendance or punctuality causes concern, appropriate levels of challenge and support will be implemented. If a child's attendance falls below 90%, they are classed as persistently absent. In such cases, the Headmaster will contact the Authority on Education Welfare Officer, who may initiate legal processes if parents/carers are not meeting their legal obligations. Our child absence and punctuality priority remains to take a 'support-first' approach, working with students and families to overcome any barriers to attendance. Parents can continue to monitor their child's attendance and punctuality via Edulink. Behaviour expectations

We are proud that Ofsted rated our behaviour and attitudes as Outstanding, and we remain fully committed to maintaining these excellent standards. We have all kinds of behaviour expectations, including the use of assemblies, and while they may be described as strict, our policies are available on the school website, and we ask all students to uphold our CREDIT values and embrace our atomic habits (page 3). Atomic habits are the small, seemingly insignificant things which if done consistently lead to positive outcomes. By setting high expectations for behaviour, we foster an environment that promotes both academic excellence and personal wellbeing. During the last academic year, we introduced several key changes to our behaviour and discipline policy:

- A structured response to classroom disruption: following a warning and behaviour point, students can expect to receive a Same Day Detention if disruption persists. This reinforces expectations and minimise loss of learning.
- Any unauthorised use of mobile phones result in a Same Day Detention.
- Persistent disruption is addressed with appropriate consequences and targeted support to help students engage positively with school life.

We continue to take a clear and consistent approach to behaviour, offering support where needed while maintaining high standards that define our school community. Your support is greatly appreciated in this area.



- we are also hoping to set up a Young Carers group at school where our young carers can meet for refreshments and a chat.

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

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


